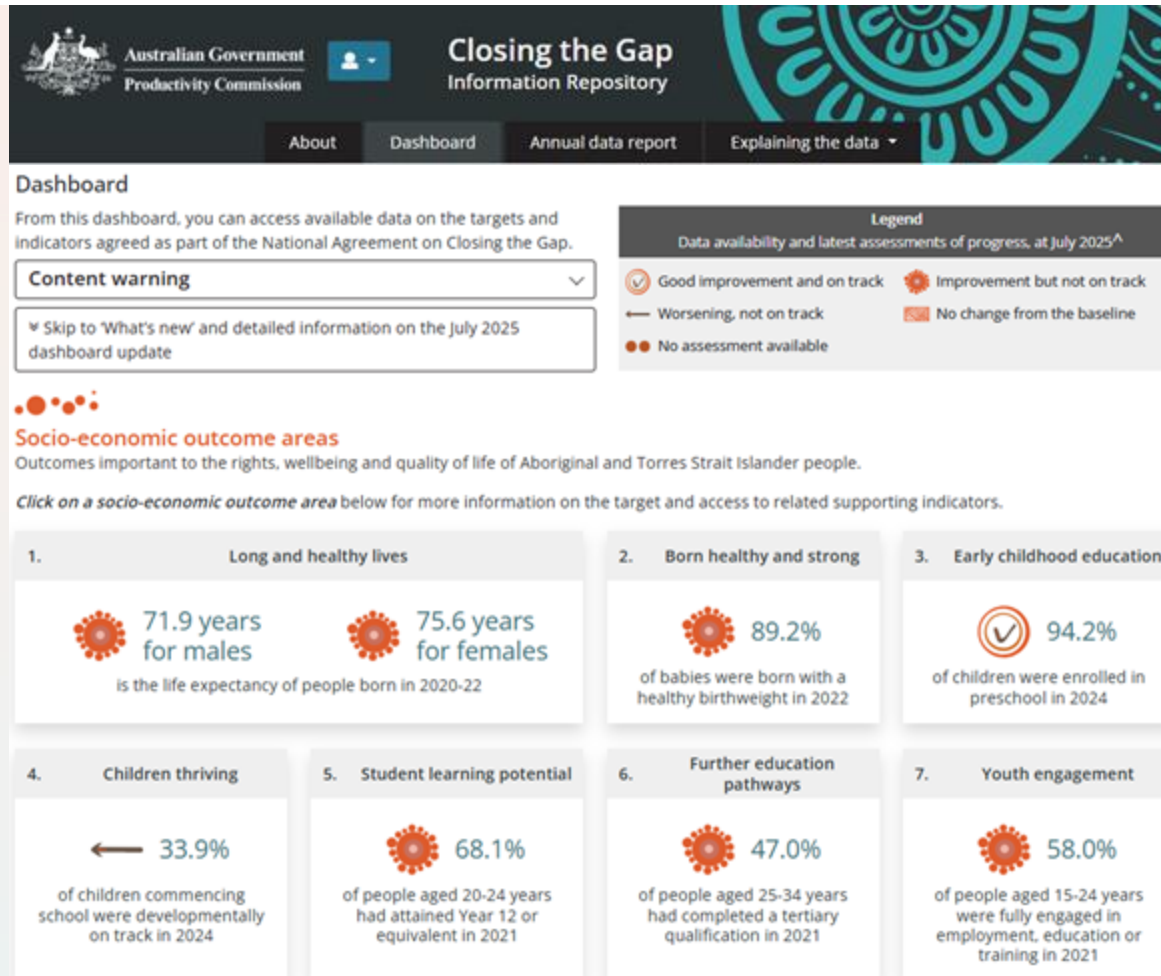

# The information repository continues to report mixed progress

## Fifteen socio-economic targets with data available to assess progress



**4 targets show good improvement and are on track**



**6 targets show improvement but are not on track**



**1 target has no change from the baseline**



**4 targets are worsening**



**4 targets cannot be assessed**

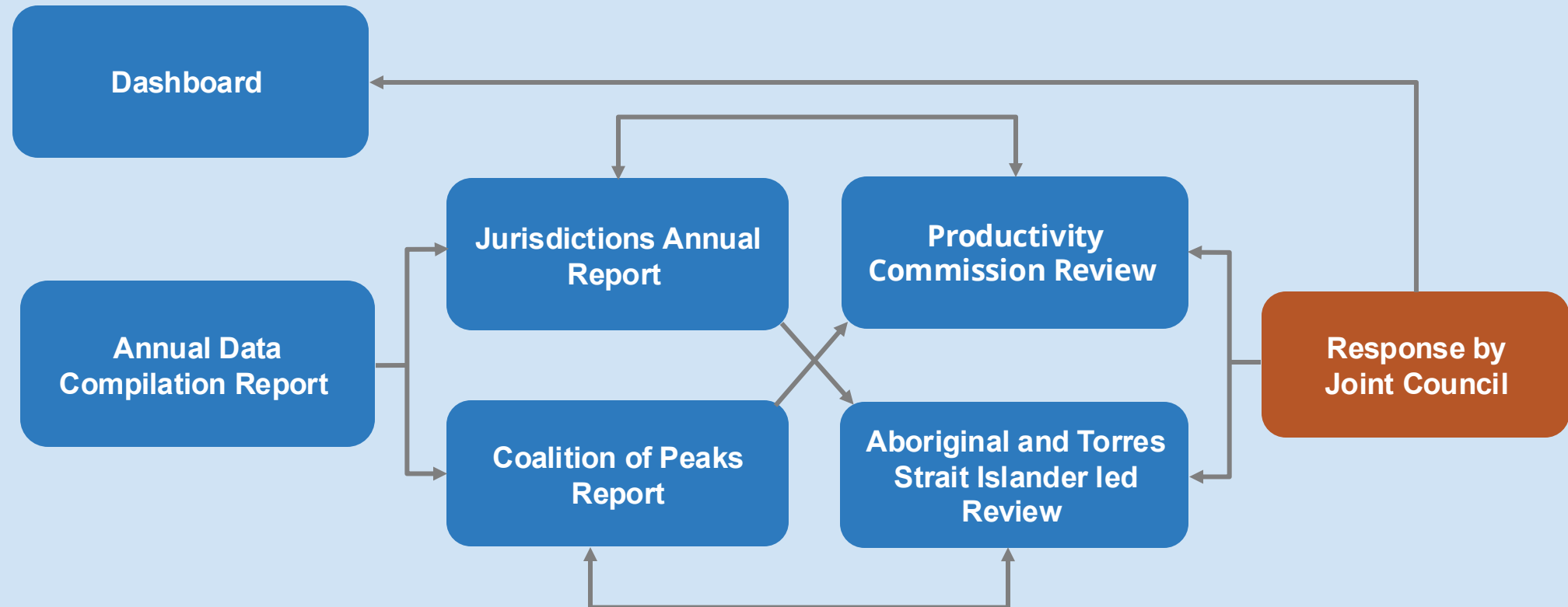

# Beyond the headline - considering context

## Disaggregations

- provide insights into the outcomes and experiences in different regions and population groups

## Supporting indicators

- help to understand the drivers for change and context to the outcomes

## Historical and ongoing context

- promote a richer understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people/s and the historical contexts that help explain current day outcomes



# Indigenous story-telling through the data

*When it comes to the histories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, it is data that tells our stories on a grand scale. Each statistic or number in a data report can be traced back to a person – an individual star – who happened to be asked or chose to share their story with others.*

# The work is ongoing

## Data gaps:

- There is no data to assess progress on the Priority Reforms
- We do not have an assessment of progress for four socio-economic targets
- Many targets have only been assessed once
- The dashboard reports on 54 of the 164 supporting indicators
- 150 data development items

## Community level data

- has the potential to provide more relevant information for local decision-makers and local partnerships
